In the name of god Amen the xxth day of may in the yeare of our lord god, one thousand five hundred foure score & nine I William Bearde of Churchill, beinge sicke in bodie but (god be thanked) of perfecte memorie do make my last wyll & testament, in mann[er] & forme following Firste I bequeathe my soule int [th]e handes of allmighty god my maker only saviou[er] & redeem[er]: & my body to [th]e earthe, whe[n]soever it shall please him to call for it. my worldly good(s) I dispose as followeth First I give unto my broth[er] George Bearde, one heifer of two years old, on els forty shillings in money I also give unto my daught[er] Katherine tenn shillings: leavinge all farth[er] save of x^s to be distributed by my wife, & oth[er] h[er] Friends as she shall desire: all the rest of my goodes moveable & unmoveable, my debtes & legacies payde & funerall discharged, I give unto my wife, & my sonne Nicolas, who[m] I do make my whole and lawfull executors
