first I geeve & be queath my Sowle to all mightie god hom[e] I trust to be my Saviour & Redeemer & my boody to be bered in the church yard in Chu[r]chill & for my Temparall estat I geeve as Folloeth

Item I geeve & be queath to Ellener my wyfe halfe my house all stufe al brase peaweter lynen beddinge & what soe ever as ar in dores & the other stuffe to my son Wyllyam Equally to be devided be tweene them after my desses

Item I geeve to Annes my dafftar Twentie poundes of Corant money of England to be paied her by my Executors that daye three yeare after my death & if plese god that shee marrie afo[r]e, then to paye her Ten pound of he[r] marriage daye & the other ten pounde that day Twel moneth aftar

Item fo[r] all the Rest of my goodes un be queereth I geeve to my son Wyllyam and home I make my hooll & sooll Executor to paie my debts & legecies be queathed in wyttnes heare of I have sett my hand the daye & yeare above saied

I doe appoint Tho[mas] Sessions & John Squires to see this my Will full filled
