In the Name of God Amen in the twenty second day of may in t[he] yeare of o[ur] Lord God 1698 according to Compvaction of the Church of England I John Birdsey of Churchill in t[he] County of Oxon Taylor being weak of body but in perfect memory & remembrance praysed be God do make & ordaine this my last will & Testament First I bequeath my Soul into t[he] hands of Allmighty God my maker hoping I through t[he] meritorious death and Passion of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and Redeemer to Receive Free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and for my Body to be buried in Christian burial at t[he] disposal of my Exect[utrix] hereafter nominated First I give to my Brother GorGe Birdsey t[he] sume of one shilling Item I give to Gorge Birdsey the son of Gorge Birdsay the sume of five pound as a Legace to be paid to him at his age of Five and twenty Item I give John Birdsey t[he]son of Gorge Birdsey the sume of one shilling as a Legacie Item I give to Gorge Birdseys daughter Dina Five shillings as a Legacie to be paid by my Exec[u]tor Item I give to my trusty & wel beloved frinds Henry Collett and Thomas Daveis t[he] sume of one shilling a pice whom I do make trustes and Overseers of this my Last will & Testament according to t[he] true meaning As for t[he] rest of goods which god in mercy hath bestowed upon me I leave it to t[he] disposal of Margaret Birdsey my wife whom I do make Exect[utrix] Paying for my funerall In Witness hereof In witness In witness hereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seale t[he] day & yeare First a bove written
