Will of Humphrey Bower, Vicar of Churchill, 1583

In the name of god amen In the yeare of oure lord god a 1583 and the fist of marche I Humphrey Bower clearke late vicar of Churchill in the countie of Oxford beinge feble and sicke in bodie but whole in minde and of perfect reme[m]brance doe make this my last will and testame[n]t in manner and forme followinge first I bequeathe my soule to allmightie god my maker and redemer and my Bodie to be buried in the chauncell or churchyearde of Churchill It[em] I geve unto the mother churche ijd It[em] I geve and bequeathe to Raphe Webster all my Working aier apparell that is to saie a coate a dublet a shirt a pair of hoses a paire of shoes and a capp It[em] I geve unto Jone Carter my blewe gowne It[em] I geve unto An[n]e Carter xij^d It[em] I geve unto Edward Carter one blacke gowne and my olde letheren dublet. It[em] I bequeathe unto everie one off my god children ij^d a peece It[em] I geve unto Elisabethe Budd and Kateren Waters ether of them iid and to Old mother hope ijd It[em] I geve unto Raphe Webster his wife and everie one of her children[n] ij^d a peece It[e]m I will that ij dozen of bread be geven amongest the poore at the daie of my buriall It[em] I geve unto everie scholler that is at my buriall a pennie It[em] I geve unto everie one in the almes house of nourto[n] beinge aged, a penie The rest of all my goodes not geven And bequeathed I geve and bequeathe unto Edward webster whom I doe make my whole executor to see this my last will performed Last of all I doe desire and make
