Will of John Bradshaw, Husbandman of Sarsden, 1568

Testamentum Johannis Bradshawe de Saresdon

In the name of god amen the xv daye of Marche in the tenth yere of the reivne of o[ur] Soferaigne ladie Elizabethe by the grace of god Quene of Englande France and Irelande defender of the faith etc. I John Bradshawe of Sarsden in the Countye of Oxford husbandman being sicke in body and whole in mynd and parfytte in remembrance doo this make my last wyll and Testamente in maner and forme following, First I bequeth my sowle unto allmightye god who redemed me and all man kynde and my body to be buryed in the churche yarde of Churchyll, Allso I gyve to Alice Bradshawe my kynswoman the thirde parte of my goodes moveable and unmoveable bothe in the fylde and Towne Allso I gyve unto Wyllyam bradshawe the foresaid Alices brother xl^s to be setforth to his moste commoditye and profette immediatelye after my deceasse Allso I gyve to Ursula Mullington the sum[m]e of fyve markes the w[hi]ch was her Fathers legarcye Ite[m] I gyve to Wyllyam Mannsfylde one hogge to be delyvered to be delyvered to hym at Martylmas nexte following after my deceasse All the rest of my goodes movable and unmovable I gyve to Alice my wyffe whom I make my hole executrixe to see this my last wyll and Testament p[er]formed my detts payed and my funerall discharged These bering Wytnesse Francis duckette parson of Sarsden
