March ye 28th 1704 I Hannah busby of Churchill in the County of Oxford widow do declare these enshuing lines to be my last will and testiement first I Commit my sowle into the hands of almighty god in shore and sartaine hope of a Joyfull resorection my bodey to the earth from whence it came without pomp but decently buried as to all my woarly goods and Chatels I give into the hands of my ex[e]cetour Here after named for the payment of all My debts and funearill Charges Itam I give to every on of my Children that is to say William Wheat James Katrin Elizabeth Thomas and John to everie on of them one shilling a peese Lastly I name my well beloved friend Henry Medcraft of Churchill seaniour to be my executor of this my last will and testiement In witness whereof I set my hand in the day and yeare above written delivered in the presents of
