In the name of god Amen I Ales Gatt of Churchill In the county of Oxon widowe beinge sicke in bodie but of good and pefect rem[em]brance doe make this my last will and testemende in manner and forme followinge first I be= queathe my soule to almightie god and my bodie to the grounde It[em] I give unto Thom[as] Jett my sonne all the moneye yet be owinge and due the comoditye of the following excep= tinge one acre for barley and one land for wheate It[em] I give unto Thomas my sonne one lande for wheate in the midle furlonge It[em] I give unto Ales and Joane my daughters one acre for barley lyinge at Crosten Shrubbe my sonn[e] Tho^{mas} findinge seede to sowe hit and payinge for plowinge It[em] I give to Thomas and Ales my children my part of the cowe at home to be parted equallie betwixt them and my bacon pigge It[em] I give unto Katheren my daughter one paire of shetes The rest of all my goods my will is shall be equalie devided betwixt my chil= dre[n] Thomas, Ales and Joane It[em I doe make Thomas and Ales my chilldren my Exequtors, Ano d[o]m[ini] 1600 fifth day month february
