Will of Nicholas Gyles, of Sarsden, 1595

In the name of god a Ame[n]: th^e ijth day of June in the yeare of our Lord god 1595 I Nycolas Gyles of Sarsden in the countye of Oxon[ford] beinge sicke in body but (god be praised) of P[e]fett memory Doe make my last will & testament in forme as followeth: I first bequeath my soule into the hands of god & my body to ye earthe wherever he shall call for it: my wordldly goodes I thus dispose I give unto Katherine my wyfe all my woode & all my woole I also bequeathe unto her to use duringe her life my best bedd w[it]h all th[e] furniture thereof: & allso all my linen cloathe nowe aboute ye house: w[ai]ch bedd w[it]h furniture & line[n] remayning aft[e]r my wyfes deathe I give unto my sonne John Item I give unto my sonne John Gyles four shinte cloathes of new cloathe two of th[e] best sorte & two of th[e] worst the rest of my goods moveable & immoveable (my debts & legacyes payd & fun[er]all discharged) I give unto Katherine my wyfe & my sonne John: who I doe make & ordayne my whole & lawful executors. But my will is ye[tha]t this parte of goods giv[e]n to my sonne by virtue of executorshippe shall not be delivered unto him untill the end & expiration of four years next followinge: & in[th]e meanwhile my wyfe to have th[e] use & occupatio[n] of it. And further my wyll

is if th[a]t my sonne doe decease before he be married that the[n] such of those goods in this my last testame[n]t give[n] & bequea thed unto him as shall be remayninge w[i]th him & not spent shall be & remayne unto my cosins Alice Hawle Margaret Hawle & Mary Ha[w]ke: but ye great p[ar]te thereof to remayne unto my cosin Alice Hawle. Witness to this my last testament Johne Clapto[n] John Beard & Symon Haule
