Item I give and bequeath unto my two two Grandaughters

Mary and Katherin Harris one shilling each a piece,

Milton the Sume of one shilling to be in full of what he shall

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Richard Harris all my goods
money and Chattles to that I shall dye possessed ^{of} and my said son Richard
Harris I make my Sole executor of my Last will and testament paying
my Just debts and funeral expenses

And I disanul and Revoke all wills at any time heretofore by me made in in writing whereof I have set my hand the day and year above written
