Will of Francis Haselwood, Churchill, 1650

In the name of God Amen The Nyne and twentieth Day of January in the yeare of our Lord God One Thousand six hundred forty & nyne I Francis Haselwood of Sarsden in the Countie of Oxon beinge (god be praised) of perfect memory although sicke in body Doe make & ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme as followeth first I bequeathe my Soule to Allmighty god hopeing by the merritts and Death of Jesus Christ only to receive remission for all my Sins and my body to the earth when it shall please god to call for it And for all my worldley goods I dispose of them as followeth

to them for the best benefitt of my children and the sayd stocks & goods to be delivered unto my sayd children at such time as my fore named friends shall think fitt and requisite And allso my Will and Desire is that if any of my sayd children shall dye before they shall receive their parte of my goods that then my Overseers shall despose of the same amongst the rest of my children at their discretions as they shall thinke fitte
