In the name of god amen I John Huckham sycke of bodie whole in mynde and p[er]fette in reme[m]brance do this make my last wyll and testam[en]te in maner and forme followenge First I bequethe my soule to allmy[ght]ie God and my bodie to be buried in the churchyard of Churchill I geve and bequethe to the churche of Churchill ij^s and to the church of Sar sdon ij^s I geve and bequethe to my brother Will[ia]m my best ctle my best hat my best shurtt my best doiblett my hoses my showes I geve to my brother Thom[a]s xiij^s iiii^d Item I geve unto Will[ia]m my sonne a [?] of barley ij bushellys of pulse and xj shepe or ellys iiij^s apiece at hys plessure Item I geve and bequethe unto Alys my daughter x shepe orellys xl^s in monie whether she will Item I geve unto the sayd ales all my pewter and brasse ij payre of Shetes a bordclothe a towell clothe a land of wheate or ellys a be v^s whether she wyll on[e] bushell of barley and one bushell of pulse and ij cople of hennys and a cocke Item I bequethe to gylbert my sonne x shepe orellys xl^s whether he wyll and one of my best brasse after that the lord is S[er]ved and the bead that I ly in all that is my owne w[i]th a payre of shetes a land of wheate or v^s in monie whether he wyll a curnocke of barley ij bushell of pulsse, also I bequethe unto the said gylbert all my graynes unbequethed w[i]th my stickes of blacke clothe Item I geve to dorothie Harrys my god daughter a shepe orellys iij^s iiij^d whether she will allso I geve unto John Hawlys children any one a shepe or allys iij^s iiij^d apece whether ^{they} wyll. And all the rest unb quethed I geve unto my sonne Richard whome I constitute and make my true and lawfull executor to se this my last wyll and testame[n]t p[er]formed. Allso I geve to Ric[hard] Samson ij^s Item I geve unto Ric[hard] huckham sonne unto Will[ia]m huckham ij^s to se this my last wyll

and testame[n]t p[er]formed and to helpe to provide & to sett forthe the most com[m]oditie of & proffett of my sayd sonne gylbert All the goods and cattallels to hys use allso I geve unto S[ir] Frances p[ar]son of Saresdon ij^s that bearinge wytnes S[ir] Frances duckett good ma[n] Robyns Marian Samson and Ric[hard] Samson with others
