Will of Robert Jefrey, of Churchill, 1622

In the name of god amen the vth day of Maie in the year of o[u]r lorde god one thousand six hundred & twentie and two I Robert Jefrey of Churchill in the countie oxon beinge sick in body but of pe[r]fect memorie thanks be given unto god doe make my last will and testament in manner and forme hereafter followinge First I commende my soule into the handes of almighty god my savior and redeemer hoping to be saved by the merets of Jesus Christe And my body to be buried in the churchyarde of the p[ari]sh church of Churchill aforesayde Item I doe give to the poor of Churchill sixe shillings and eighte pence Item I doe give and bequeath unto my kinswoman Alice Jefrey three pounds of money to be payde unto her within half a year after my deceasse Item I doe give and bequeath unto my nephew Robert Joyner one cupperd a goode chest and a table board to be delivered unto him after the deceasse of his grandmother Item I doe give and bequeath unto my nephew William Joyner that chest in the wearnhouse and a brasse potte Item I doe give & bequeath unto my nephew James Joyner one brasse ion Item I give and bequeathe unto my Kinswormen Margrette Jefrey and Anne Jefrey to everie one of them foure shillings Item I doe constitute & ordayne and appointe my wife Joane Jefrey and my sonne in law Gilbert Joyner my executors to whom I doe give and bequeath all my goodes not herein all ready bequeathed Item I doe owe to my ne[p]hew Thomas Jefrey three poundes
