Will of Catherine Loveday, of Churchill, 1599

In the name of god amen I Katheren Lovedaye of Churchill in the countie of Oxon widow beinge sicke in bodie but of good and perfect remembrance (thankes be to god) doe make this my last will and testament the iiiith daye of novemb[er] in the year Of oure lord god 1599 in manner and forme followinge First I bequeath my soule to almightie god and my bodie to the grounde to be buried in the churchyard of Churchill affore saide It[em] I gave unto Jhon Lovedaye my sonne one cowe wythe a scar in the face and one calfe the younger of the twaine It[em] I gave unto Ales Lovedaye my daughter one blacke cowe and the older calfe The rest of all my goodes my debts beinge paide and my funerells discharged my will is shalle equally devided betwixt my two children Jhon and Ales Lovedaye, and I doe make my sonne Jhon my whole and sole executor desiringe my neighboure Wyll[iam] mynchin to be overseer to this my will to see tis fullie fulfilled and kept
