In the name of god Amen the seaventh day of January in the yeare of our Lord god one thousand six hundred thirty six I Friswide Medcraft of Churchill in the county of oxon widdowe beinge sicke in bodie but of perfecte memory I thanke my god doe heare make my laste will & testament in manner & forme as followeth first I bequeath my soule into the hands of almighty god my maker & to Jesus Christe my redeemer and my body to be buried in the churchyarde of the ch[ur]ish of churchill aforesayed Item I doe give and bequeath unto henry medcraft my sonne all my corne which is found in the field and all my pulse which is to thresh: Item I doe give & bequeath unto my daughter Anne Fletcher my best gowne Item I doe give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary harvy one feather bed one fine sheete & one fine pillowboard and my best hatt and my best cloake and one brasse panne Item all my goodes & substance not given & bequeathed before I wholely give & bequeath unto my daughter Alice medcraft Item I doe make henry medcraft my sonne executor of this my last will and testament
