Will of Mary Minchin, Widow, of Churchill, 1669

In the name fo God Amen, I Marie Minchin of Churchill in the County of Oxon widowe, upon the tewntieth say of Julio [June] in the on[e] and twentieth yeare of the Raine of ou^r Soveraine Lord Kinge Charles the second, And in the yeare of ou^r Lord God One Thousand Six hundred and nine, beinge in perfite mind and memorie, thankes be unto Almightie God my maker, doe make Constitute ordaine and declare, this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following, Imp[rim]is I give and bequeath my Soule unto Almightie God my maker wi[i]th whome I trust to be by his worth Jesus Christe my Savior and redemior, And my Bodie to be buried in the Church yard of Churchill aforesaud, at the will of my Executor, And for my wordlie goods I give as followeth Item I give to Marie Willkes my Granchildthe Sum of eaighteen pounds o flawful monie tobe paide hir at the Age of one & Twentie yeares, And the Intereste to be paide hir, in the meane time annlie, Item I give unto the Said Marie one Fetherbede one Fether bolster one Fether Pillowe one peare of blankets, three peare of Sheets, one bed healinge one Brase pan three pewter platers, Item I give to Thomas Wilkes the Sum[e] of nine pounds of Lawfull monie to be paid unto him [arte of ot towards his findinge

of ^{him} an aprentis, at the dicretion of my Executor& overseeres, and the remainder when he come out of his aprentishipe,

Item I give to Marie Michin daughter ^{of John} Minchin Four pounds of Lawfull monie to be paid at the Age of Fouteene yeares All the rest of my goods I give unto my SonninLaw John Minchin whom I make my full and hole Executor of this my Last will and Testament, And I doe Desire my lovinge friends William Sessions and Thomas Mullington to be my Overseeors of this my last will and Testamen^t In witnes here of I have Sett my hand and seale the daye and yeare first above writen

Wheras t[he] sayd Mary Minchin hath given & bequeathed Severall Sums of mony unto Thomas Wilkes & Mary Wilkes her Grand Children it is t[he] sayd Mary Minchins Will that if either of tehm dye before the mony is due to them by the sayd will then it Shall be equally devided betweene John Wikes & Peter Minchin & Thomas Minchin sons of John Minchin or ^{to} the longest liver of either of them
