Will of Simon Morton, of Sarsden Lodge, 1628

In the name of god Amen: the tenth day of Nov[em]ber, the yeare of our lorde god one thousand syxe hundred twenty & seven: I Simon morton of Sarsden lodge, in the county of Oxford, beinge sicke in body, but of good, & p[er]fect memory thanked be god doe make this my last wyll, & testam[e]nt in man[n]er, & forme followinge, first I be= queath my soule unto allmighty god, in su[r]e, & certayne hope of et[er]nall salvatio[n] by the sacrifice, & merits of my Saviour Christe Jesus : & my body to the earthe whensoever it shall please god to call for it.

My worldly goodes I dispose as followeth. I give unto my daughter Joyse twenty pounds of lawfull englishe money. I give unto my sonne James tenn pounds of lyke english money. I give unto my sist[er] Johan Watts ten shillings : The rest of all my goodes moveable, & unmoveable, (my debts & legacyes payd, & fun[er]als discharged I give unto Johan my wife, who I doe make my whole, & lawfull executor
