The form of the oath to be administered to the Executrix above named  
laying **her** hand upon the holy Bible or New Testament.

*You shall swear that you believe the Will hereunto annexed to be the true and last Will and Testament of **Thomas Mullington of Churchill** deceased, so far as you know or believe, and that you shall well and truly perform the same by paying **his** Debts and Legacies so far as the said Goods, Credits, Debts will thereunto extend and the Law charge you. And that you shall make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular, the Goods, Credits and Chattles of the said deceased: and the same so made do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the Registry of the **Archdeacon Court of Oxford** at such time as shall be assigned unto you, also a true and just account when you shall thereunto lawfully required. So help you God, and by the holy contents of the Book.*
