Will of John Mydleton, of Sarsden, 1555

In the name of god ame[n] the viiith day of December September in the yere of o[u]r lord god 1555 I John Mydleton of Sarsesdene in the co[u]ntie of oxon beinge sounde of mynde and of good remembrance although I be syke in bodie make my testament in maner and forme followinge First I bequethe my soelle to allmyghtie god and my bodie to be buried in the parishe church yarde of Churchill And I wyll that Alys my wyffe an John my sonne shall have and occupie together equally all my goodes moveable and unmoveable in filldes & in Towne receave all profettes and allso paye all charges equally together betwyxt them And I will allso that my saide wyffe Ales and John my sone shall delyv[er] to Edwarde my sone and Thomas allso my sone and to ether of them when they shall come & be of the age of xviii yeres one acre of wheat one acre of barle[y] and one acre of pulse that is to saye vi acres betwyxt them and to ether of them one hayfer of vij yeres of age iii Ewes & iii lambs to ether of them a payre of shets & a coveringe of a beade to ether of them a pott and of every kinde of pewter to ether of them one And I ordayne & make Alys my wyffe Executrix of this my present will & testament Those beinge W[it]nesses – Thomas constable Richarde Webb John Hokame Will[ia]m Mynchen and others
