Will of Henry Odoms, of Churchill, 1591

[In the] name of god ame[n] the xixth day of the monethe of July in [the y]eare of our lord God 1591 I Henry Odoms of Churchill in [the c]ountie of Oxon beinge sicke in bodie but of whole and perfect [rem]enbrance (laude and praise be to allmightie god) make [this m]y p[re]sent testament countering given my last will in manner [and for]me followinge vidz first I com[e]nd my soule to almightie [god] my maker and redeemer and my bodie to be buried in the [church]yard Churchill afforsaide. It[em] I geve unto Jhon my sonne [the cu]bberd and table bord in the hall It[em] I geve unto George [my son]ne all my workinge toules wythe all the tymber It[em] I [geve]unto Ales my daughter the cubberd in the chamber a rounde [illegible] and xx^s to be paid when her mother shall think fit [and] meete for her It[em] I geve unto Anne my daughter the great [illegible] the best but one a joined frame and square table, Also [my w]ill is that Em[m]e my wife shall have my house wythe all [illegible] usuallie belonginge to this as longe as she keepeth [hers]elfe a widow payinge to my son Jhon viij^s yerelye [illegible] the rest of all my goodes not geeven I geeve and [bequea] the unto Em[m]e my wife whom I make my whole and [sole] executrix these beinge witnesses
