In the name of god Amen the seconde of Maie in the yeare of o[u]r lorde god 1575 in the xvij yeare of the Raigne or o[u]r Soveraigne Ladie Elizabethe by the grace of god Quene of Englande France and Irelande defender of the Faithe etc I Will[ia]m Pearse of Churchill beinge sicke of bodye but in p[er]fytt memorie doe make my last wyll and Testament in manner Followinge First I bequeathe my soule unto allmightie god my saviour and redeemer w[i]shing to reste eternally and my bodie to the earthe whensever yt shall please god to call me owt of this transitory lyffe my worldlye goodes I doe dispose as Followethe I give unto my sonne will[ia]m Pearse one potet the lease of two one coofer w[hi]ch my sonne Thomas will delyver him And one olde barrell I give unto Thomas Pearse the sonne of Peter Pearse deceased one stall of bees to be delivered unto hym whe[n] he shallbe thoughte to be of reasonable age [?] the same I give unto Elizabeth Pearse one heffer one stall of bees and two platters the w[hi]ch goodes shallbe payed unto her at her age of sixtene yeares or at the daye of her marriage if it be before she be of the age of xvj yeares I give unto Roberte Pearse and unto Henri Pearse one heffer the w[hi]ch my sonne Thomas shall breade unto either of them one stall of bees. I gyve unto the poore of the parish xij^d Fynallye all the Residewe of my goodes unbequeathed movable and unmovable my debtes and legacies beinge payed and my bodye layed in earth I give unto my sonne Thomas Pearse whom I doe make my whole and lawfull executor w[it]nesses and ov[er]seeres of and to this my last Testament to be well and trewly had fullfylled and p[er]formed are these Rich[ard] Mander Will[ia]m Whyttler John Whyttler Will[ia]m Trewman
