Will of Thomas Rowland, of Sarsden, 1613

Tho[mas] Rowland de Sarsden

In the name of god amen; I Thomas Rowland of Sarsden in the county oxon, beinge (god be praysed) of p[er]fect memory, doe make & ordayne my last will & testame[n]t in man[er] & forme followinge. First I bequeath my soule into the hande of allmighty god, fro[m] who[m] I surrendered the same, in sin[cere] trust & confidence that by the only sacr[i]fyce and mediatio[n] of my redeem<sup>er</sup> Jesus Christ he wyll receive the same into his celestial glory my worldly goods I dispose in manner followinge. I Dispose & give unto John Bennet, Anne Bennet & Johan Bennet, even unto each of them fower sheepe: I give unto Robert Bennet, yf he returne fro[m] Londo<sup>n</sup>, not bounde to any ma<sup>n</sup> an apprentice, the residue of suche money as I sent to Londo<sup>n</sup> to have bene bestowed about the bindinge of him an app[re]ntice, that is not spent, & layd out in charg[e]s & expenses concerninge him. It[em] I give to my godsonn & goddaught<sup>er</sup>s that I have xii<sup>d</sup> It[em] I give to Anne Beard the daughter of George Beard one of my best ewe sheepe. It[em] I give to Walt<sup>er</sup> Bennet & John Wilkins my App[ar]ell to be divided betweene the[m]. It[em] I give unto my broth<sup>er</sup> Richard Rowland my beast heyfer or fower sheepe at my wyves choyce: I allso give him two kyne to be payd him aft<sup>er</sup> my wyves disease, or yf it may please god to enable that in wealth at that tyme so to doe: It[em] I give to John Watson my kynsman fow<sup>er</sup> sheep: & the bourds & transoms on the backesyde

of my house; I allso give him my shoppe, payinge unto my wyfe syxe pence ev[er]y weeke, so longe as he shall use the same shoppe: The rest of my goods moveable & unmoveable; (my debts & legacies payd & fun<sup>er</sup>all be discharged) I give unto Cyciley my wyfe, who[m] I make my whole executrix. I request my good neyghbours Sampso[n] Rawling & George Beard to assist my wyfe, that this my last wyll may be fulfilled, accordinge to my inst[ruction] & true meaninge he<sup>re</sup> specified: & for theire paynes I give the[m] two shillings.
