Will of Phillip Tappan, Husbandman of Churchill, 1657

In the Name of God Amen

I Pillip Tappan of Churchill in the countie of Oxon Husbandman Doe this First day of May Anno D[o]m 1631: beinge in perfect memorie thanks bee given to God make and ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner and forme as followeth First of all I comitt my Soule into the hande of Almightie God hopeinge to be saved by the merritts Jesus Christ and my body to be buried in the Churchyard of the parrish Church of Churchill And for my worldly goode I thus dispose of them as followeth Imprimis I give to my sonn Michaell Tappan twelve pence Item I give to my sonn Robert Tappan twelve pence Item I give to my Daughter Anne Bulline the wife of Leonard Bulline the sume of Five Pounds of Currant Money of England to be payd within one yeare next after my death Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Marshall the wife of Humfry Marshall the Sume of Forty shillinges of lawfull money of England to be payd within one year next after my decease Item I doe Constitute appoint and ordayne my wife Brigitt and Charles Tappan my sonn to be joint Executors of all the Rest of my Chattles and Cattle movables and unmovable In witnes whereof I the sayd Phillipp Tappan have to this my last will and Testament Setting hand and Seale the day and year above written the marke of Phillipp Tappan written read and sealed in the presence of Thomas Glynn, William Crosse.

Proved at London, 13th day of February 1656, before the Judges for Probate of wills.

By Bridgett the relicte of the said deceased and Charles his son, joint and soul Executers.
